**ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**

1. United States citizenship
2. Good character
3. Scholastic excellence
4. College student with a major or minor in History with an emphasis on American or Native American Studies
5. Financial need (Financial Aid office must recommend the applicant)

APPLICATION is by letter addressed to the chair of the scholarship committee: Ms. Julie Pittmann, 1462 Waterman Rd, Rosalia, WA 99170. The student's Personal Statement should describe his or her interests, personal history, and future ambition, explain his or her financial situation, and **MUST** include the following:

- Transcript of grades
- A record of achievements (for example, honors, awards, service, scholarships)
- Completed Scholarship Application form
- A Letter of Character
- The applicant's full name and address. Award recipient will need to provide their social security number due to reporting requirements.

**APPLICATION must be postmarked by January 20, 2022**
